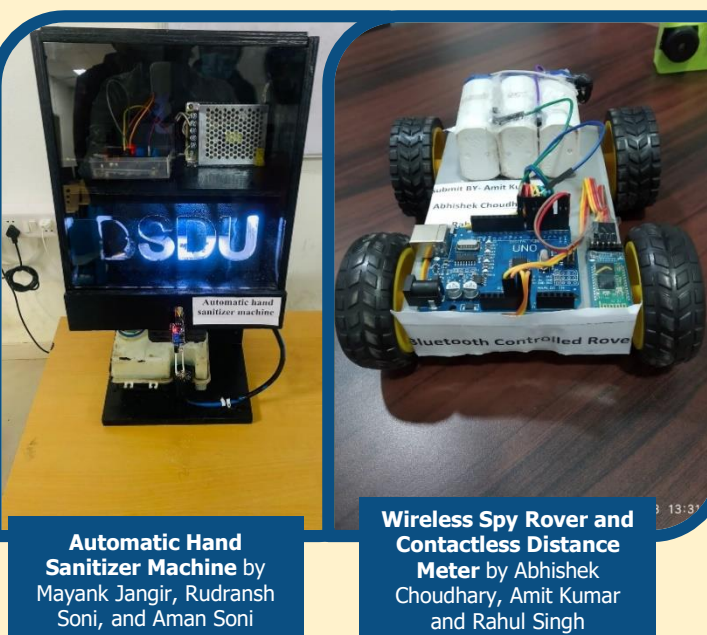
Display of Talent @ Project Exhibition

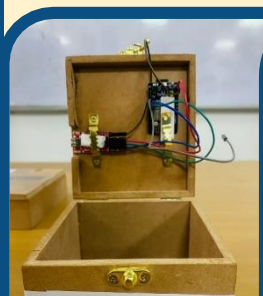

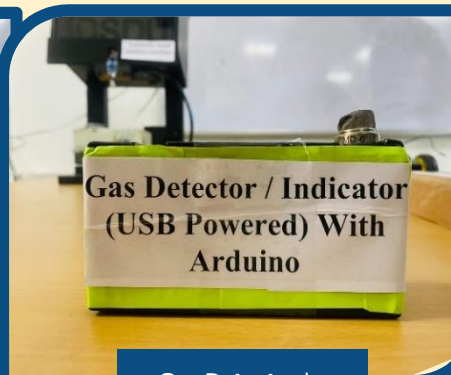

Detailed report by President on the progress of the University.

President, Prof. Achintya Choudhury presented a report on the activities of the University and addressed the graduating students: "The competence and confidence you have earned from your education and training at this University will certainly enable and empower you to meet the challenges ahead. Bangalore and Delhi in January 2022. He added that it shall be a moment of pride for BSDU to see the seven students awarded for their excellence in the India Skill Competition 2021, further representing the country in the upcoming World Skills Competition 2022 in Shanghai, China.



The Chief Guest **Prof. Anil D. Sahasrabudhe**, Chairman AICTE, on the occasion of first Convocation of BSDU, delightedly congratulated the students on receiving their B.Voc., M.Voc. and Ph. D. degrees from the exemplary and the first Pure Skill University. He informed the students about the freedom of choice provided by the new National Education Policy (NEP) to the students of vocational courses for skill development with its multidisciplinary approach and also about the due weightage given to all types of skills. "Good afternoon everyone!

I am very delighted and happy to be in the midst of all of you here on this occasion of the first convocation of Bhartiya Skill Development University. Chairperson, BSDU, Mrs. Ursula Joshi ji, President, BSDU, Prof. Achintya Choudhury, Chief functionary, RUJCT, Mr. Jayant Joshi, Members of the board of Management, Members of the Academic Council, Dr. Sangeetha Noval, Registrar, faculty members, all the technicians who have been associated with this university from inception and dear students and their parents, It is indeed a festive occasion, a happy occasion, the first convocation of Bhartiya Skill Development University is happening today. On this very auspicious occasion my congratulations to all the students who are receiving their Diploma in Vocation, Bachelor of Vocation, Master of Vocation and Ph. D. in Vocational degrees from this first ever created private Bhartiya Skill Development University. I know the genesis. We pay our homage to the memory of Late (Dr.)

Rajendra Joshi whom I met for a very short while. In one of those meetings, I found the passion with which he has started this university putting in all the money that he has earned from Switzerland and bringing it to India for the development of skills in our country. The roots being from Rajasthan, he decided to do it in Jaipur and I am sure all the students who have taken benefit of this particular university in terms of skilling themselves providing them the world class facilities in terms of not only education but the practical hands on learning which will go a long way not only in terms of employability of all of you, dear students who are graduating today but some of you will turn out to be entrepreneurs in the same line as Late (Dr.) Rajendra Joshi and will create more universities, more centres for skilling of our youth in our country. On this occasion, I look forward to the system that was imported from Swiss System, of what we call Dual System, some part of the theory being done in the college environment or university or classroom and then the remaining part of hands on being undertaken in the real life industry, has been taken to the next conclusion with huge infrastructure facilities being created here in Jaipur.

I am sure many universities who have started round the same time and much later, all will take a cue from this exercise, the experience that this university has been able to learn and take to the next level of not only skilling, lot of research and development, lot of entrepreneurship abilities being developed in terms of creating incubators on the campus, thereby students get an opportunity to become



businessmen or creating their own start-ups. This is what the nation is looking for. Today we are at a crossroads, we have just completed a cycle of pandemic, unfortunately this has come about hundred years later. Dr. Rajendra Joshi was also unfortunately not here because of the same reason, we need to rededicate ourselves that it is not only skills in terms of manufacturing but also in terms of medical industry. He was himself from medical/pharma background, so how we can create new drugs/medicines, how drug delivery systems can be created which will help people/patients from remote areas, like rural areas, and tribal areas. I think that is another area which needs to be addressed in terms of skilling. Our skill-sets in terms of art, craft, design, may be music, dance, drama is also equally important. It is not just manufacturing skills or assembly skills or what we call the marketing skills are also equally important but all variety of skills and our nation is known for –aap sab jaante hain 64 kalao ke baare mein hum baat karte hain, there are 64 skill sets and how each one of them can be imparted in a university system of this nature with lot of vertical mobility, horizontal mobility, someone who has gone to an engineering or an arts college, does not fit there and wants to do something on the skilling side, must be able to join anytime or someone who is doing here skill part of it, vocational part of it, wants to go and earn a BA in Economics, that flexibility is also required. And fortunately, the new National Education Policy empowers by way of providing all of this in a package deal where multiple entry, multiple exit is possible. Student, whatever he wants to learn or she wants

to learn, the choice is that of the student and how we can provide this education at a very affordable cost and that's why while we talk about excess equity, we also talk about affordability, we talk about accountability, we talk about accreditation of our programs, so the new National Education Policy with all its phenomena is going to really enrich our education system and will be the best amongst all the countries of the world. We look forward to that day where every student who has entered into the higher education sector, forget about that, even in the school sector, from the high school onwards will have ample opportunities to get themselves skilled and become employable. And most important part is this particular skilling, right from school time will entertain the families in terms of what is required to be done in the future but we will also learn the lessons of dignity of labour and therefore a country of our size of 1.4 billion, with very few skilled manpower who are available today to take it to a new level where by more than 60-70% students will all get skilled, will create high quality products, high quality processes and the nation will get benefitted in the process. Our economy will grow. Large number of jobs will get created and the whole world will look forward for India as the destination for manufacturing or any other services for development. With these few words, I once again congratulate all the graduating students, the hard work that the teachers and faculty of this institution have put in and parents who have sent you for getting high quality education, My Pranaam, Namaskar, Greetings to all of you and my best wishes for all of you to excel. Jai Hind! Namaska!"

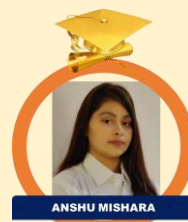

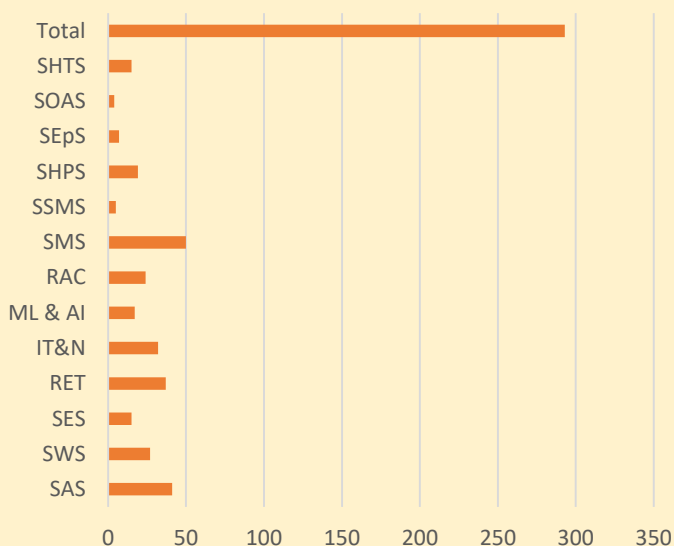

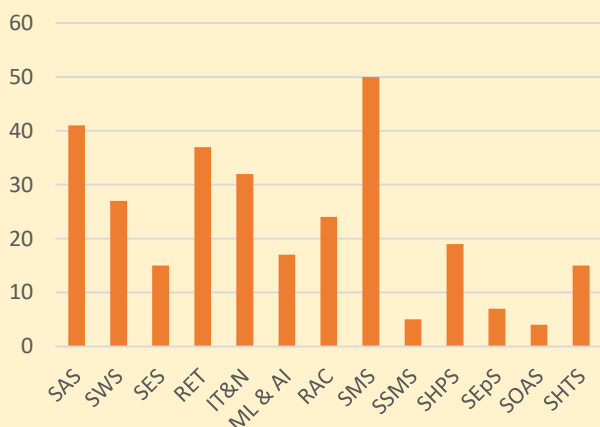
From the T&P Cell

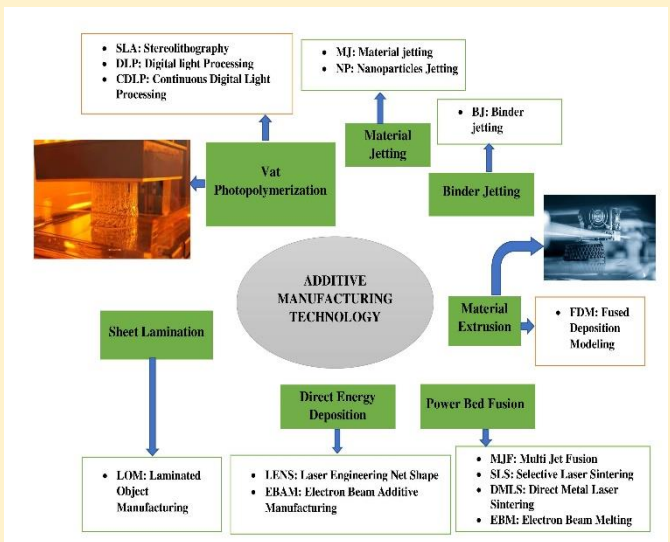

3D Printing: Emerging Technology in the Current Scenario

3D printing technology can print an object layer by layer thereby depositing the material directly using a computer aided design (CAD) model. Charles Hull invented stereo lithography, the first commercial rapid prototyping technology commonly known as 3D printing, in 1983. 3D printing is also known as Additive manufacturing. A 3D part is created by building up layers of material to create an additive process. Additive manufacturing processes are the opposite of subtractive Manufacturing processes, which remove raw materials to create final products.

Nowadays, 3D printing is widely used in the world. 3D printing technology is increasingly being used for the mass customization, production of any type of open source designs in areas like agriculture, healthcare, automotive and aerospace.

Types of 3D Printing

Different types of 3D printing technologies have been developed with different functions:

1. Binder Jetting

Binder jetting process starts with the powder material being spread over the build platform using a roller and then the print head deposits the binder on top of the powder (where specified). The build platform lowers to allow for the next layer, and the process repeats until the item is complete. Powder that is not bound is removed.

2. Directed Energy Deposition (DED)

In DED, powder-based or wire-based materials are melted and deposited using a focused thermal energy source, such as a laser, electron beam, or plasma arc. The process can make metal, ceramic, and polymer parts, but it is mainly used for metal parts and in more hybrid manufacturing where the substrate bed can be moved to create complex shapes.

3. Material Extrusion

To construct 3D parts, continuous filaments of thermoplastic or composite materials are used as the most popular AM process in terms of availability and quality. The material in the form of plastic filament fed through an extruding nozzle, where it heated and then deposited onto the build platform layer by layer.

4. Material Jetting

A process in which droplets of wax-like materials are selectively deposited on a build platform. As the material cools and solidifies, layers of materials can be stacked on top of each other. After the build, support structures are either mechanically removed or melted away.

5. Powder Bed Fusion(PBF)

In PBF, there are four types of energy sources: laser fused, electron beam fused, agent and energy fused, and thermally fused. The energy source melts either plastic or metal powder particles, which solidify and fuse together to form the object. The powder bed fusion process uses two chambers, a build chamber and powder chamber, as well as a coating roller.

6. Sheet Lamination

This 3D printing technology builds 3D objects by stacking and laminating thin sheets of material through bonding, ultrasonic welding, or brazing. To create the final shape of the object, laser cutting or CNC machining is used.

7. Vat Photopolymerization

An ultraviolet (UV) laser is used to cure photopolymer liquid resin in a vat layer by layer, turning it into hard plastic parts. The three most common types of this technology include Stereo lithography(SLA), Digital Light Processing (DLP), and Continuous Digital Light Processing (CDLP).

Retrofitting Prospect

Retrofitting means to furnish something with new or modified parts or equipment not available or considered necessary at the time of manufacturing.

Steps to consider before retrofitting a vehicle are:

1. The overall vehicle should be in good shape.
2. Identification & removal of all ICE-related hardware, includes engine, fuel tank, fuel line, muffler, exhaust, starter, radiator, etc.
3. Selection of electric motor based on size of vehicle, expected performance & weight.
4. Battery pack is to be decided i.e. Li-ion, Lead Acid or Fuel Cell.

Note: Li-cells are smaller, lighter & can enable for longer ranges but are expensive & require more protection on electronic boards (No. of cells required are based on vehicle & available space to fit them).

5. Power controllers to regulate the flow of energy between battery & motor, a charging system to replenish the battery via an electric circuit, wiring harnesses & myriad other components.

Rough Estimation: For a 2-W bike it can cost around 30k to 80k.

Advantages of Retrofitting:

1. Low operation cost per km as compared to petrol or diesel engine operated vehicles.
2. Low maintenance cost.
3. Comfort by both mentally & physically.
4. Almost negligible emissions.
